

**Missouri Repeater Council**  
**Annual Meeting October 11<sup>th</sup>, 2025**  
**Held at SPARK-CON Sedalia, Missouri**

Present at the meeting:

There were 12-15 members present at the meeting

The meeting was called to order at 10:04 by James Adkins.

James announced following: next year's annual meeting will be held in the St. Louis area with location, date and time to be determined.

There are no UHF frequencies available in the Kansas City Metro area. A list of frequency pairs was shared with the membership that will be de-coordinated and returned to the pool of available frequency pairs January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026.

Email notifications will go out in December for repeater owners/trustees to update and verify their information. It was asked that all repeater owners/trustees provide alternate contact with verifying their repeaters.

Treasurer's report was given by Dennis. As of October 1<sup>st</sup> the balance is \$3018.18

Officer elections: The President stepped down to have the election held. As the Vice-President was not in attendance the Secretary conducted the nominations and election of the positions that were up for election.

James Adkins was reelected President

Glenn Schulz was reelected Vice President

Bob Brown was reelected Director at Large

Anthony Potenziani, KC0AMP was elected Director at Large

Membership dues: James Presented to the membership that dues would remain at \$10.00 per repeater with a maximum of \$100.00 regardless of the number of repeaters. Repeater owners/trustees would only have one vote regardless of the number of repeaters. A motion was made and seconded. The motion passed with all present voting in the affirmative.

UHF Spectrum: James presented a plan to the membership to amend the Council's bylaws to allow the coordination of repeater outputs from 441.300 to 441.975 MHz for repeater outputs with corresponding inputs from 446.300 to 446.975. This would allow for a minimum additional 28 UHF repeater pairs statewide. 441.300 to 441.475 would be reserved for 12.5 kHz narrow band repeaters. 441.700 to 441.975 would be standard 25 kHz spacing analog or digital repeaters. After considerable discussion it was decided that protection would be added for the DTV repeater in St. Louis. 2 MHz guard channels would be created to provide protection. A motion was made and seconded to approve the changes to the bylaws. The motion carried with only one no vote cast. James will follow up with changing the database and updating the coordination rules on the web site.

James Presented the purpose of the Council and stated that it should be a resource for repeater owners. He also went over the coordination process.

With there being no further business or discussion the meeting was adjourned at 11:00.
